


Fashion Marketing and Communication - IED Firenze Daniela Xicoira

Along with triangles made out of resin, black triangle depicting black magic and purple triangle depicting white magic, placed opposite to each other in a form to show reflection and transition. Triangles are utilised because they direct energy and power in the direction they are pointing towards."







